#### **REC - Year 7 Swimming**




Over the last 3 weeks of term 1, all classes in the school attended swimming lessons at the ARC. The skills developed are essential for the safety of students around water and build on what they have learnt in previous years. The students enjoyed the lessons and the weather was kind for the walk to and from the pool.

The students learnt skills including The Department for Education's Water Safety program which is designed to engage, challenge and support students to:

- become confident and safe in aquatic environments
- develop skills and understanding directly related to water safety (survival and rescue skills)
- explore, evaluate and make sound decisions about their own safety, and the safety of others, in aquatics environments
- work effectively with others.

The children engaged in a broad range of activities including using kick boards and noodles, learning how to tread water, star floats, collecting items from under the water, duck diving, swimming with life jackets, pool safety and water rescue procedures.



The Centre staff commented on the excellent behaviour of the students during their lessons.

#### From the Principal

Dear Parents.

Welcome back to school after the holiday break. From May 14-16 NAPLAN takes place



for years 3,5 and 7 students. NAPLAN is a nationally developed program that provides schools, states and territories with information about how education programs are working and what areas need to be prioritised for improvement. NAPLAN tests are just one of many assessments your child participates in to support learning and improvement in achievement.

Students do not have to learn specific skills for NAPLAN tests. NAPLAN tests are administered simultaneously in all schools across Australia. NAPLAN consists of 4 tests; Reading, Writing, Language Conventions (spelling, grammar and punctuation) and Numeracy. All students are encouraged to participate in the NAPLAN tests.

Individual student reports are provided to all parents/caregivers and show the achievement of an individual student in a series of bands. Individual reports are expected to be ready for distribution to parents/caregivers during September.

For some students, NAPLAN can provide some anxiety. It is important that as parents, not to build on these fears, as the test is part of the school and national assessment processes and is not something to be concerned about. The teachers who administer NAPLAN ensure that the students are comfortable and reassure them if needed. Often the feedback from year 3 students undertaking the tests for the first time is that they find the tests fun and a change from how school is normally. At East Marden PS, we are using the paper based tests rather than the online testing. This was determined by the Department for Education.

This term, we will be developing a new vision statement for East Marden. It will build on the 2017 developed values and motto for the school. The values are:

- ◆ Respect
- Kindness
- Perseverance
- Creativity

The school motto, which is on the fence on James Street is 'Learners today, Leaders tomorrow'.

Developing the vision will be done with the staff, students and parents. More information about how you can contribute ideas will be circulated this term.

Finally, with an early outbreak of the flu season, please ensure that you keep your child home if they are unwell to avoid spreading illnesses, and that you encourage regular hand washing to keep germs at bay.

#### **INFLUENZA**

Notifications of confirmed influenza have been much higher so far this year compared to the same period last year.

Here are a few hints and tips to help protect yourself and others against the spread of Influenza.



#### Avoid close contact.

Avoid close contact with people who are sick. When you are sick, keep your distance from others to protect them from getting sick too.

#### Stay home when you are sick.

If possible, stay home from work, school, and errands when you are sick. This will help prevent spreading your illness to others.

#### Cover your mouth and nose.

Cover your mouth and nose with a tissue when coughing or sneezing. It may prevent those around you from getting sick. Flu and other serious respiratory illnesses, like respiratory syncytial virus (RSV), whooping cough, and severe acute respiratory syndrome (SARS), are spread by cough, sneezing, or unclean hands.

#### Clean your hands.

Washing your hands often will help protect you from germs. If soap and water are not available, use an alcohol-based hand rub.

Handwashing can help prevent illness. It involves five simple and effective steps, Wet, Lather, Scrub, Rinse, Dry. Regular handwashing, particularly before and after certain activities, is one of the best ways to remove germs, avoid getting sick, and prevent the spread of germs to others. It's quick, it's simple, and it can keep us all from getting sick. Handwashing is a win for everyone, except the germs.

#### Avoid touching your eyes, nose or mouth.

Germs are often spread when a person touches something that is contaminated with germs and then touches his or her eyes, nose, or mouth.

#### Practice other good health habits.

Clean and disinfect frequently touched surfaces at home, work or school, especially when someone is ill. Get plenty of sleep, be physically active, manage your stress, drink plenty of fluids, and eat nutritious food.


