

### Netball

### Netball nominations open for Winter Season 2020

As the Summer netball season draws to a close in just a few weeks it is time to put out the call for nominations for Winter Season netball.

Students in Years 2-7 are invited to nominate to play school netball in the 2020 Winter Season which runs from May 2019 to August 2020. Nomination Forms can be collected from the front office or can also be emailed on request. Important Information:

- Netball is open to both girls and boys (boys up to age 12).
- ♦ To be eligible students must be turning 8 before the 31 December 2020 (ie. 7 year olds can play as long as they will turn 8 in 2020).
- Until 9 years of age children can play Netta (beginner's netball) for a great introduction to playing a ball sport. Netta is a modified form of netball for younger children played on a standard netball court but with shorter goal posts, a smaller ball and more relaxed rules.
- Games are held on Saturdays in the Winter season as follows:
- Netta (7-9 year old beginners) 10:00am, 11:00am or 12:00pm
- Primary (9-11 year olds) 12:00pm, 1:00pm or 2:00pm
- ♦ Sub-Junior (11-13 year olds) 1:00pm, 2:00pm or 3:00pm
- Court locations are either Emery Road, Campbelltown OR Lothian Ave, Windsor Gardens OR Phillis St, Maylands.
- Exact times or locations of games are not known until they are released by EDNA in April.
- Training days will be dependent on the availability of parent volunteer coaches. At the moment training is on Tuesdays or Wednesdays.
- Cost is \$80 per season and you will be invoiced by the school once a place on a team has been confirmed.
- Nomination forms must be returned to the front office by Thursday 12 March.

Please note that netball at East Marden is 100% run by volunteer parent coaches and teams will only go ahead if there are enough parent volunteers willing to coach and/or manage teams.

Who can play?	Open to boys and girls born in 2012 or earlier (i.e. turning 8 or older in 2020)
When are the matches?	Saturday mornings, between 8:30am and 11:50am in terms 2 & 3
	The 1 <sup>st</sup> match will be in Week 2 of Term 2. No matches on the long weekend.
Where are the matches?	East Torrens Primary School (8s & 9s)
	East Marden Primary School (10s)
	Paradise Primary School (11s & 12s)
What about training?	Players will be expected to attend training as well as matches
	Training will be 1 day a week at EMPS, straight after school until 4pm
	Exact day will depend on availability of volunteer coach
What is to be worn?	Special EMPS polo top and shorts supplied on loan for the season
	Shin pads/guards with long socks over the top
	Soccer boots or ordinary sneakers
	Sunscreen & mouthguards are recommended (but not compulsory)
	If glasses are worn while playing sport a spectacles policy is available
Who are the coaches?	YOU! We need parents to coach. The coaching role can be shared if desired e.g. one parent does training (and gets to pick the day of training), another does matches, another as team manager.
Do kids need to be "good" players?	Kids don't need to have played before. They need to commit to the season and demonstrate good sportsmanship. Their skills will develop and their fitness improve.
What does it cost?	\$60 for the whole season (Terms 2 & 3)
When do registrations close?	Friday 28 February 2020
	Kids will miss out if their forms aren't submitted by then
What about Club soccer?	Kids are allowed to play for Club and EMPS, as the competition schedules usually don't clash.
	However, Club soccer costs considerably more - between $10-20$ times the fees of school soccer

Volunteering is the key to school sport. If there is no parent to coach, there is no team, and kids will miss out, or parents will have to pay the hundreds of dollars that soccer clubs charge in order for their kids to play. We will support parent coaches with training, materials and guidance.



#### Active travel options at East Marden




Car parking around East Marden is always really busy, especially Shepherds Lane cul-de-sacs, Mines Road and James Street.

Did you know that you can park and walk, scoot or ride to school from:

- Geoff Heath Golf Course Less than 250m from school (kiosk is open for coffees in the morning!)
- 2. The ARC car park 800m from school

The registration of interest for secondary school form allows parents of public school students starting secondary school in 2021 to advise of their preferred secondary school.

The registration of interest for secondary school form will be available online

You can access the online form from a computer, tablet or mobile phone, as long as you can connect to the internet. It replaces the old paper form referred to by schools as an ED176.

The form has a unique URL for your child and applying online is easy.


Simply follow the steps below.

- STEP 1 From Term 2 you will receive an email or letter with the unique URL for the registration of interest for secondary school form for your child.
- STEP 2 Complete all mandatory fields.
- STEP 3 Once you have completed a page click on the 'NEXT' button.
- STEP 4 Once you have filled out all pages click the 'SUBMIT' button.

Paper forms will be available from your public primary school if you cannot access the internet. Parents of private school students wishing to attend a public secondary school in 2021 should email education.startingsecondaryschool@sa.gov.au for a form.

#### What do I need to do now?

Make sure my child's primary school has my current email address and my child's correct residential address.







Free home-based assessment and treatment for 7 to 12 year old children with fear and anxiety disorders.

Does your child become very afraid of certain situations or objects, worry about a lot of things, get very distressed, or try to avoid things they fear?

#### About the study

Our team at Griffith University may be able to assist you. We are conducting a nationwide study that includes the following services at no cost to families:

- A thorough assessment of your child's anxiety with a trained psychologist via the telephone;
- Your child receiving one of two kinds of homebased treatments delivered on a PC, laptop or tablet: and
- Two follow-up telephone assessments with a trained psychologist 6- and 12-months after treatment to track your child's progress.

The study aims to find out if these two treatments are as effective as each other, and which children have the best response to each kind of treatment. This will mean that there are more evidence-based treatments available for helping anxious children.

#### About the treatments

Each treatment involves your child completing treatment sessions at home on a PC, laptop or tablet.

Each treatment involves your child learning practical strategies to better manage anxiety.

- One treatment helps children learn to control the focus of their attention on helpful things around them.
- The other treatment helps children learn to think differently and approach things they fear.

Each treatment includes information, telephone or email support for parents in assisting their child to better manage anxiety.

Prior studies have shown that children who complete each treatment experience significant reductions in anxiety.

#### Contact us

This study is being funded by the National Health and Medical Research Council and is led by Professor Allison Waters and a team of experts in childhood anxiety disorders.


